Spring is a time to be reflect on all that God has provided. We rejoice that two more partner families are moving into their homes, one in Vulcan and one in Kingsford. We are thankful for all the volunteer hours, donated material, donated money, and donated services that go into each home.

Spring is also a time to reflect on future plans. Habitat's goal is to serve four families in 2010 and five in 2011. One of the keys to reaching this goal is expanding into Iron County. Thrivent Financial is providing much of the funding for the construction of a home in Iron County in 2010 through its Thrivent Builds program. An Iron County Habitat Team is being organized to complete the build and to hopefully continue building in the future.

One way to improve our community is to clean up abandoned and tax reverted properties. Most of these houses are in a sad state of repair and many should be taken down. The land could then be made ready for new construction or sold to neighbors. One mechanism to facilitate this, which has been successful in most counties in Michigan, is a Land Bank. This is a county appointed board with the ability to accept property, clear title, work with local authorities to find a property's best use, and sell the property. Habitat is currently working with community leaders concerning a Land Bank for our area.
