The 2012 construction season is well underway with three homes completed (Aurora, WI, Norway, Kingsford), four homes in progress (Kingsford, Crystal Falls, and two in Norway) and one additional home in Kingsford which will be started in the fall. The Kingsford home under construction is a rehab donated by Wells Fargo, the remainder of the homes are new construction.




Carpenter's Club


