## **The Director's Chair**

I am continually amazed by those who spend their vacations to help those in our community. In June we had a group from Amery United Congregational Church in Amery, WI spend a week working on the renovation of our newest house site, 726 Stephenson Street in Norway.

Eighteen members of the twenty member team are pictured with the new back basement wall. The original front and rear basement walls were leaning so the group put temporary walls in to support the house, removed the blocks, and installed new walls.

This is the second year that we have been blessed with having the Amery UCC group come to our area to make a difference. There is more about their work in Norway on Page 2 of this newsletter.

#### Funding our Projects

I often hear people talk about the free homes that Habitat gives away. Well, this is not true. We firmly believe in a "hand up, not a hand out" approach to our projects.

The homes that we build are done in partnership with the families. Families must complete **Sweat Equity** (200 hours of volunteer labor which can be done on their home, other build sites, in the office or ReStore, and at fundraising events) and then pay an affordable mortgage for the home.

Families also pay for their repairs, the monthly payments vary depending on their income and the size of the project. Most families pay between \$25 and \$50 per month. The mortgage payments and the repair project payments are then used to pay for materials for additional projects.

Other sources of income for Habitat include proceeds from the ReStore, grants, donations, and fundraising events. I invite you to participate in the Run for the Walls 5K on August 11th and in the Raise the Roof Golf Outing on August 16th. I would love to see you as a participant, volunteer, and/or sponsor!



#### Run for the Walls 5K

The 3rd Annual Run for the Walls 5K race will be on Saturday, August 11, 2018. It begins and ends at Lodal Park in Kingsford. The race course goes past 5 Habitat homes.

## **Work Started on Rehab House in Norway**



In May we started gutting a donated house in Norway with several Women Build teams. In June, the Amery UCC Mission Team continued with the rehab project by removing the garage, and replacing the front and rear basement walls. Pictured at left is installation of one of the jack posts to support the house while the walls were removed (shown at right).

We are currently in the family selection process for a partner family for this house.



## **Recent Repair Projects**

So far in 2018 we have completed 8 repair projects and are currently working on an additional 3. We also have another 11 in the planning stages.

Of the completed projects, 5 were **critical repair** (2 furnace replacements, water heater replacement, septic system replacement, leaking plumbing) and 2 were accessibility related (wheel chair ramp and concrete parking pad which eliminated 15 steps into house).

The remaining completed project involved installing a shade awning on the porch so a cancer survivor can access the outside while minimizing sun exposure. We had repaired the deck in 2017 but did not get the awning installed until 2018.

## **Siding Project**
