2019 Repairs

Homeowner Occupied Repairs are a growing part of our mission. There is a large need in our area for help for income eligible families in performing critical repairs on their homes.

The Habitat office averages five calls a week from families seeking help.

The repairs range from critical repairs (furnace replacement, roof replacement. septic system/ sewer lines, plumbing repair) to

accessibility issues (ramps, railings, porches, parking pad) to minor repair (siding, doors and windows, exterior painting).

Many of these repairs were done with volunteer labor, thank you!

One of the families whose home we are in the process of repairing had issues with their septic system. The tank had imploded, and the resulting situation resulted in the home being unfit for living for over a year.

The remains of the septic tank can be seen in the bottom left image, and there isn't a whole lot left of it. Fortunately, the new tank was put in and the family has moved back into their home.

We are always looking for volunteers to assist us in helping our families in need, and it would be great to see you on the next job site!
