The Director's Chair

I am proud to announce that our affiliate was voted Michigan Affiliate of the Year 2020. This honor is due to this community and the tremendous support we receive for our programs.

One of the statistics tracked by Habitat for Humanity International is the number of families served by each affiliate. We have been the top small affiliate in Michigan for 10 of the past 11 years and in the top 15 of small affiliates in the US for 8 of the past 9 years.

Families served includes all families served by the affiliate, both with home ownership and with home repair. Our home repair program has grown from 1-2 repairs per year to 20-25 repairs per year. I thank each person who has helped our repair program grow.

Operation Shingle Storm 2

We are in the midst of Operation Shingle Storm 2, a repeat of 2019's successful Operation Shingle Storm—a repair blitz for veteran's. We are re-siding a house in Kingsford and will be installing a wheel chair ramp on another house in Kingsford.

Our 19th Annual Raise the Roof Golf Outing was held on June 4, 2021. Ninety-two golfers enjoyed a beautiful (although a little warm) day at TimberStone. New House Start

Our next new construction build will be in Kingsford at 112 Sagola Ave. This house start has been delayed due to the increase in the cost of construction materials over the past year. Current plans are to start the house sometime in 2022.

You might ask: What did the core crew do this past winter without a house to work on?

The core crew spent the winter doing repairs in the ReStore and working on construction storage. We were fortunate to get a grant from the Dickinson Area Community Foundation and from an individual donor to buy a 24' car hauler and the supplies to fit it out as our new onsite construction trailer.

In 2021 we have completed 12 repairs and another 4 will hopefully be completed by the end of the year. There are still many more in the pipeline.

Of the 12 completed repairs 8 were for veteran families. Six of the completed repairs were for disabled homeowners.
